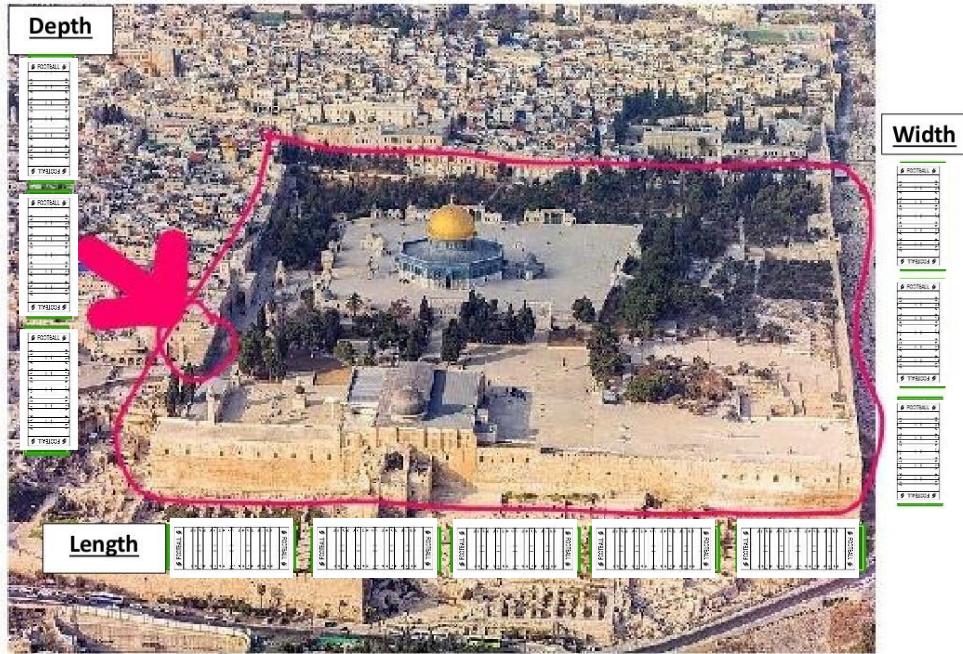


The “Greatest Prophecy” in the Bible that Every Jewish and Gentile Person Needs to Consider

The Romans destroyed the Second Temple in 70 A.D., so the Jews have NOT been able to observe the Day of Atonement Feast Biblically for 2,000 years. The Jews need and want a Third Temple but can’t build it because the “Dome of the Rock” sits on the Temple Mount.

Dimensions of the “Retaining Wall” Surrounding the Temple Mount



The Temple Mount is the “**center point**” of the earth and the most valuable and contentious piece of real estate anywhere on earth. Many Biblical scholars believe the “Garden of Eden” was situated near Temple Mount, which is also the location of the First and Second Temples. The “Dome of the Rock” now sits on the Temple Mount. Photos of the “Temple Mount” and “Retaining Wall” surrounding it **DO NOT** demonstrate the structure’s magnitude.

To gain perspective, I drew a **Red Circle** around the “Temple Mount” to highlight the **Retaining Wall** that encircles the “Temple Mount.” **IT IS MASSIVE**. To the left are a **Red Circle and Red arrow** indicating where the “Western Wall,” Israel’s Holiest site, is located relative to the “Retaining Wall.” It’s called the “Western Wall” because it is on the “Western” side of the “Retaining Wall.” Notice how small the “Western Wall” is relative to the “Retaining Wall.”

I also used the “football fields” image to help you visualize the Length, Width, and Depth of the “Retaining Wall.” Each football field image represents 100 yards or 300 feet.

How was the Temple Mount Constructed?

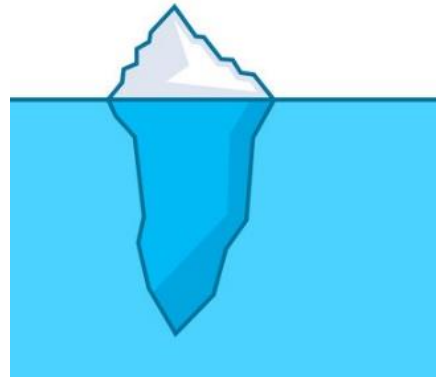
Israel is a mountainous country. Jerusalem sits on top of a “Hill” (mountain.) Therefore, the Jews built a “Retaining Wall” **around** this “mountain” and filled in the void with rocks.

The “Western Wall”



The “Western Wall” (**Red Arrow**) height is 60 feet. However, the “Retaining Wall” depth is over **900 feet**. To put that into perspective, consider an “iceberg.” You can see 10% of its mass, but 90% of an iceberg’s MASS is underwater, so you cannot see it.

In recent years, tunnels have been excavated under the “Retaining Wall.” You can tour these tunnels when you visit Israel and the “Western Wall.” You will walk “down” many winding, narrow metal stairs until you reach a “platform” where you can look over the handrail and “SEE” the **foundation** of the “Retaining Wall.”



Six-Day War

During the Six-Day War in 1967, the Jews regained control of the Temple Mount. But they didn’t remove the “Dome of the Rock” and rebuilt the Third Temple. “**Logic**” says they should have, but they gave up control to “Jordan.” So, the Jews are back to square one. They want a Third Temple, but the Dome of the Rock is on Temple Mount.

What to do?

The answer concerning the Third Temple is contained within the most significant prophecy in the Bible, which was given to Daniel by the **Angel Gabriel**.

Angel Gabriel

The angel Gabriel appeared to only **three** people in the Bible. The first person was Daniel. The second person was Elizabeth, the wife of Zechariah. Elizabeth birthed John the Baptist. Gabriel's third appearance was to Mary, who birthed Jesus Christ. Here are the verses concerning the birth of "John" and "Jesus," which were preceded by the appearance of the angel Gabriel.

God's Angel "Gabriel" Gives Daniel a Prophecy of "70 7's" or 490 Years

The Nation Israel continues in Her rebellion and unbelief. God announces through the prophet Jeremiah that Israel will be taken captive to Babylon for 70 years. King Nebuchadnezzar comes and destroys Jerusalem and the First Temple and takes Daniel and his Tribe to Babylon. Two or three years **before** the 70 years of captivity is over, the Angel Gabriel gives Daniel the prophecy of **"70 7's" or "490 Years."** This prophecy reveals God's intentions for Israel, Jerusalem, The Jewish people, The coming of the Jewish Messiah, The Death of the Messiah, and The rebuilding of the Third Jewish Temple

God is NOT a Liar

If this prophecy is **not** true, then God is a liar, and if God is a liar, then by definition, he is not God. Scripture is either ALL true or it's not!

"Seventy 'Sevens' [70 x 7 = 490 years] are decreed for your people [Israel and the Jews] and your Holy City [Jerusalem]...From the issuing of the decree to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, [Messiah] comes, [His Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey] there will be seven 'sevens' [7 x 7 = 49 years] and sixty-two 'sevens' [62 x 7 = 434 years] [Therefore, the Jewish Messiah will arrive 49 years plus 434 years for a total of **483 years after the issuing of the "decree"] **After the sixty-two 'sevens,' the Anointed One will be cut off [Messiah will die] ... The people of the ruler [Romans] who will come will destroy the city [Jerusalem] and the [Second Temple] sanctuary.** [The "period" represents a **"Time Gap"** that begins. The "math" and historical accounts verify the exact dates **all** the above prophecies were fulfilled, but they only account for **483** years. Where are the missing seven years? They are revealed in the Book of Revelation and called the "Tribulation," which begins **after** the Church is "raptured" and the "Time Gap" is over] [Then **"He,"** a world leader, most likely the Antichrist, will arrive on the scene] **He will confirm a covenant with****

many [Israel and other Nations] **for “one seven.”** [7 years] [The covenant must also move the “Dome of the Rock” off the Temple Mount so that the “Third Temple” can be built there] **In the middle of the seven** [3 ½ years into the covenant], **he will end sacrifice and offering** [“he” ends the sacrificial system in the Jewish Third Temple], **And on a wing** [Most likely the Holy Place] **of the Temple, he will set up an abomination that causes desolation** [Jesus refers to **this** abomination that causes desolation in Matt 24] **until the end that is decreed is poured out on him.”** [Satan is cast into the Lake of Fire]

All of Daniel’s Prophecies before the “Time Gap” have been fulfilled.

It assures us that everything after the “Time Gap” is over will take place too and be fulfilled.

The Past

At the end of the “70” years of Israel’s captivity in Babylon. God’s Angel “Gabriel” appears for the first time in Scripture and gives Daniel a prophecy for “Seventy ‘Sevens” or 490 years.

The prophecy indicates a “decree” will be issued to rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple. This “decree” will start a series of prophetic events. King Artaxerxes became King in 464 BC and twenty years later on March 5, 444 BC, he issues a “decree” to restore and rebuild Jerusalem and the “First Temple” King Nebuchadnezzar destroyed.

This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

The prophesy indicates “7 7’s” or “49” years after this “decree” is issued, Jerusalem and the First Temple would be rebuilt. Therefore, add “7 7’s” or “49” years to the issuing of the decree and you arrive at 396 BC which is when Jerusalem and the First Temple was rebuilt and restored.

This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

The Present

The prophecy also indicates that “7 7’s” [49 years] AND “62 7’s” (434 years) for a total of 483 years will pass after the issuing of the “decree” to rebuilt Jerusalem and the First Temple before the “Anointed One” the “Ruler” would arrive. The “math” indicates that on Monday, March 30, 33 AD the Messiah arrived, Jesus’ Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem riding on a donkey. Why were there so many Jews waving Palm Branches and celebrating His arrival on this day? The Jews didn’t have internet, or social media to tell them that Jesus was coming. But the Jews did have a Bible, they knew Daniel’s prophecy and they had a Jewish calendar. This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

“The Anointed One will be cut off” refers to Messiah’s death by crucifixion which occurred on the Feast of Passover on Friday April 3, 33 AD. This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

Jesus was buried that evening on the Feast of Unleavened Bread and was resurrected on Sunday April 5, 33 AD. Historically this was fulfilled.

The “People of the Ruler” [Romans] destroyed “The City” [Jerusalem] and the “Sanctuary” [Second Temple] in 70 AD. This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

A “Time Gap” begins indicated by the highlighted period. The Jews are without a Temple and want a Third Temple so the sacrificial system can resume and they can celebrate the “Day of Atonement” as outlined in the Old Covenant. They can’t build the Third Temple because the “Dome of the Rock” is on the Temple Mount. **What to do?**

The Future

“69 7’s” or 483 years have passed and been fulfilled. But Daniel’s prophesy was for 490 years. Where are the missing “Seven Years?” These missing seven years are called the “Time of Tribulation,” outlined in the book of Revelation. Therefore, the “Time Gap” ends when the church is “raptured” and the “Tribulation” begins. Then most likely at the beginning of the “Tribulation,” the following will take place and is the final part of Daniel’s prophesy.

“He” maybe the Antichrist, will “confirm a covenant with many” so the Jews can build the Third Temple on the Temple Mount. In the “middle of the 7” [also referred to as 42 months or 1,260 days] “he will put an end to sacrifice and offering” by abolishing the sacrificial system. “On a wing of the Temple” [Holy Place] “he” reveals himself with a blasphemy initiating an “abomination that causes desolation” Jesus referred to in Matt. 24 “until the end that is decreed is poured out on him.” [Satan is cast into the Lake of Fire]

This part of Daniel’s prophecy will be fulfilled.

The “Math” and History Prove That All the Prophecies Before the “Time Gap” are Fulfilled

King Artaxerxes became King in **464 BC**, and 20 years later, on **March 5, 444 BC**, he issued a “**decree**” to rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple. Now count “7 7’s,” or 49 years after this decree was issued, and in **396 BC**, Jerusalem and the First Temple were rebuilt.

The Jewish Messiah, “Anointed One,” will arrive in “7 7’s” **and** “62 7’s for a total of “69 7’s” or 483 after this “decree” is issued. Jesus’ Triumphal Entry was on **Monday, March 30, 33 A.D.**

The Messiah was “cut off” (died by crucifixion) on **Passover, Friday, April 3, 33 A.D.** In **70 A.D.**, “the people of the ruler” (Romans) came and destroyed the city (Jerusalem) and the sanctuary (Second Temple). The “Time Gap” begins.

The Past –

605 BC

King Nebuchadnezzar invades Israel and destroys Jerusalem and the First Temple. He takes the Israelites to Babylon for **70** years, fulfilling Jeremiah’s prophecy.

“Because you have not listened to my words, I will summon all the peoples of the north and my servant Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon,” declares the LORD, “and I will bring them against this land and its inhabitants and against all the surrounding nations...these nations will serve the King of Babylon seventy years. “But when the seventy years are fulfilled, I will punish the king of Babylon and his nation, the land of the Babylonians, for their guilt,” declares the LORD, “and will make it desolate forever. Jeremiah 25:8-12

538 BC

The Angel Gabriel gives Daniel a prophecy regarding the “70 7’s,” which we believe is a few years before the “70” years of captivity are over. This prophecy’s prophetic timeline is based upon a “**decree**” that will be issued to rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple.

464 BC

King Artaxerxes became King.

March 5, 444 BC

King Artaxerxes issued a “decree” to restore and rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple.

This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

396 BC

Daniel’s prophecy indicates that “7 7’s,” or 49 years after this “decree” is issued, Jerusalem and the First Temple would be rebuilt. Therefore, add 49 years to the issuing of this “decree,” and you arrive at **396 BC** when Jerusalem and the First Temple were restored.

This part of Daniel’s prophecy is fulfilled.

The Present –

The Jewish Messiah is Coming

Daniel's prophecy said that "7 7's" (49 years) **and** "62 7's" (434 years) for a total of **483** will pass **after** the issuing of the "decree" (to rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple) **before** the "Anointed One," the Jewish Messiah would arrive.

Monday, March 30, 33 A.D.

The "math" indicates that on Monday, March 30, 33 AD, the Messiah, "Anointed One, the Ruler, arrived. It is Jesus' "**Triumphant Entry**" into Jerusalem riding on a donkey. Why were so many Jews waving Palm Branches and celebrating His arrival on this day? The Jews didn't have the internet or social media to tell them that Jesus was coming. But they had a Bible and a Jewish calendar and knew Daniel's prophecy.

This part of Daniel's prophecy is fulfilled.

Friday, April 3, 33 AD

Daniel indicated that "**The Anointed One will be cut off,**" which refers to the Jewish Messiah's **death**. That occurred on the Feast of Passover on Friday, April 3, 33 A.D.

This part of Daniel's prophecy is fulfilled.

Sunday, April 5, 33 AD

Jesus was buried on the **evening** of the Passover, on the Feast of Unleavened Bread. Jesus is **resurrected** from the dead on the Feast of First Fruits three days later.

We know that historically, Jesus Christ was resurrected.

70 AD

Daniel said, "**The people of the ruler who will come will destroy the city and the sanctuary.**" The **Romans came to Jerusalem** in 70 A.D. and destroyed God's "City," Jerusalem, and the "sanctuary," which is the Second Temple.

This part of Daniel's prophecy is fulfilled.

Since 70 A.D., the Jewish people have been without a Temple. For 2,000 years, the Jews have not been able to observe the "Day of Atonement" Biblically as God originally had intended. Modern Jews still celebrate the "Day of Atonement" by fasting, giving money to the poor, doing "good deeds," etc. But to celebrate the "Day of Atonement" as God originally intended, the Jews need a Third Temple, a High Priest, and the reinstatement of the Sacrificial System. The "Dome of the Rock" sits on the Temple Mount. So, why didn't the Jews remove the "Dome of the Rock" from the Temple Mount and rebuild the Third Temple after they regained control of Jerusalem and the Temple Mount in 1967?

In 1994, Israel gave up control of the "Temple Mount" and gave it to Jordan in exchange for "peace." Peace never came. **Something is going to have to happen to enable the Jews to rebuild the Third Temple.**

The Future –

“Time Gap”

We now come to a significant “time gap” in Scripture.

After the following verse, the **“people of the ruler”** (the Romans) who destroyed Jerusalem (**the city**) and the Second Temple (**sanctuary**) in 70 A.D. is a “period.” This **“period”** begins a “Time Gap” **before** the next verse, **“He will Confirm a Covenant with Many for One ‘Seven.’”**

Remember that **all** of Daniel’s prophecies **before** the “Time Gap” have been fulfilled. Therefore, this assures us that everything **after** the “Time Gap” is over will take place and be fulfilled.

The Final Seven Years

Daniel’s prophecy was for “70 7’s” or 490 years. Only **483** years have been fulfilled. The remaining “Seven Years” is the main emphasis of the Book of Revelation, also called the “Time of Tribulation.” This “time” is NOT for the Church as the Church has been gathered or raptured at the sound of the “Last Trumpet.” These final seven years will “end” the “Time Gap” period we are now in. Then, at the beginning of the Time of Tribulation...

“He will Confirm a Covenant with Many for One ‘Seven.’”

Someone is coming who will do the impossible. He will initiate a “covenant” (peace treaty) that removes the Dome of the Rock from the Temple Mount so the Third Temple can be built. The Jews already had all the furniture, “Brazen Alter of Sacrifice,” “Golden Lampstand,” etc. They must have the “Ark of the Covenant” hidden somewhere. The sacrificial system can begin again, and the High Priest will enter the Holy of Holies on the **“Day of Atonement”** to make atonement for the sins of Israel. However...

“In the Middle of the ‘Seven,’ he will put an end to Sacrifice and Offering.”

“In the middle of the seven” refers to either “3½ years,” “42 months,” “Time-Times-and a Half a Time,” or “1,260” days. For the first half (3½ years) of the “final” “Seven,” all is well, and there is peace. Then, the person who brought “peace” reveals himself, and “he” abolishes the Temple sacrifices and Temple worship.

“And on a Wing of the Temple, he will Set Up an Abomination that Causes Desolation until the End that is Decreed is Poured Out on him.”

In the “Holy Place” of the Temple, “he” declares himself to be a god or some other blasphemy. It is the **“abomination that causes desolation”** Jesus spoke of in His Olivet Discourse in Matthew 24. In the “END,” Satan is finally cast into the “Lake of Fire.”

This part of Daniel’s prophecy is NOW fulfilled.

Jesus Christ RETURNS— We don't know the day or the hour!

There are three “views” regarding the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.

The **pre-tribulation** position is that the second coming of Jesus Christ will occur **before** the beginning of the seven-year tribulation period.

The **mid-tribulation** position advocates that He will return **within** the 7-year tribulation period.

The **post-tribulation** position advocates His return **after** the Great Tribulation.

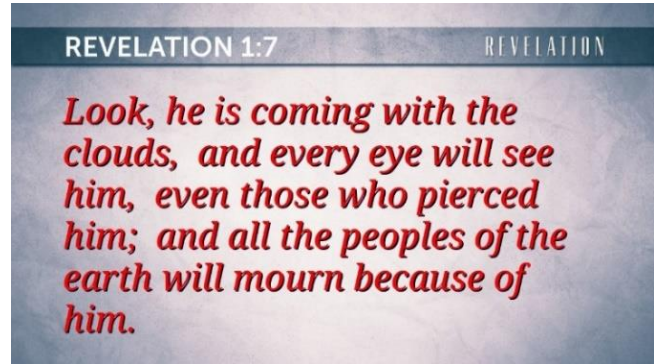
My position is that the “Last Trumpet” will sound, and “believers” will exit the earth as they are raptured or gathered to be with Jesus. The unbelievers who are “left behind” will experience the wrath of the Tribulation period. These events will occur as outlined in the Book of Revelation and Daniel 9. I believe the Seventh Angel will sound the Seventh Temple Trumpet **within** the Tribulation, and Jesus Christ will return. “There were loud voices in heaven, which said: “The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Christ, and he will reign forever and ever.” Rev.11:15–19



Jesus will RETURN at the **Mount of Olives** as the world's attention is focused here. The prophet Zechariah indicated it.

“A **day of the LORD** is coming when your plunder will be divided among you. I will gather all the nations to Jerusalem to fight against it; the city will be captured, the houses ransacked, and the women raped. Half of the city will go into exile, but the rest of the people will not be taken from the city. Then the LORD will go out and fight against those nations, as he fights in the day of battle. **On that day, his feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, east of Jerusalem.**”

Remember that the Bible is the story of God's redemptive purposes for His People, Israel. But because of their sin and unbelief, God has extended His LOVE to the Gentile Nations. Therefore, when the Jewish Messiah returns (His Second Coming) in all His glory! **"Every eye will see Him."** It includes "Israel" – the Jewish people. **"Even those who pierced Him."** **"All the people of the earth"** (Jews and Gentiles) will mourn and weep.



When Jesus returns, people at the Mount of Olives will be nearby. They will take out their camera phones, take pictures and videos, and **instantaneously** post them on social media and email. This technology has only been available in the last decade, so NOW John's "Revelation" can be fulfilled as **"Every Eye" will see Him**. Therefore, the Jewish people, "Israel," will acknowledge their sin of "Rejecting the Messiah" and will believe that Jesus Christ is their Messiah. God's ultimate plan of salvation and redemption is NOW completed. All of Surviving Israel will be "Saved." **What a "Day of Atonement" fulfilling this Feast.**

"The Math"

Anyone with a calculator and an understanding of the Jewish calendar and modern history can do the math and verify the following. The date of the "decree" to rebuild Jerusalem and the First Temple was issued and then completed. The Jewish Messiah's arrival date and His death, burial, and resurrection date. The date and confirmation of "who" destroyed Jerusalem and the Second Temple.

Was Jesus's Arrival Accurately Predicated in the Bible?

In 538 BC, the angel Gabriel gave Daniel a prophecy pinpointing when the Messiah would arrive. "Know and understand this," Gabriel told him (Daniel 9:25). While Daniel may have understood it, somewhere along the way, that insight has been lost. Old Testament scholars have long been debating the prophecy's meaning, but one scholar, Harold Hoehner, had a particularly astounding interpretation. While in Babylon, Daniel read the Scriptures, learning that Jeremiah had foretold both the Babylonian captivity and the Israelites' return to their homeland after 70 years. In response, Daniel confessed the sins of the nation in prayer, inciting the angel Gabriel to visit and deliver this message:

"Know and understand this: From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until the Anointed One, the ruler, comes, there will be seven 'sevens' and sixty-two 'sevens.' It will be rebuilt with streets and a trench but in times of trouble. After the sixty-two 'sevens,' the Anointed One will be put to death and will have nothing. The people of the Ruler who will come

will destroy the city and the sanctuary. The end will come like a flood: War will continue until the end, and desolations have been decreed.”

In taking a closer look at the Daniel passage, one thing is clear: it is about the Messiah. We see that the term “Messiah,” or “Anointed One,” is capitalized. It is also clear that a formula of sorts is provided to calculate when the Messiah will appear. The difficulties come in interpreting the formula. One such difficulty is determining the meaning of “weeks,” which is used in a number of translations. (NIV uses the term “sevens” instead of “weeks.”) In ancient Hebrew, “weeks” had a number of meanings, which scholars can determine by the context.

The context in the Daniel passage shows that “weeks” means “seven units.” Using this definition, we can calculate when the Messiah will arrive: $(7 \times 7) + (62 \times 7) = 49 + 434 = 483$ years. The prophecy further says that after the Messiah arrives, he will be “put to death and will have nothing.” The word “after” is very important. After the Messiah arrives, he will be put to death. Jesus’s crucifixion fulfills that prophecy.

We now know that the Messiah would arrive 483 years in the future. But does the prophecy specify a beginning date? The prophecy tells us: **“From the time the word goes out to restore and rebuild Jerusalem.”** So, who ordered this decree to restore Jerusalem, and when was it ordered? There are several possibilities, but the decree that best fits the evidence was made by the Persian King Artaxerxes to Nehemiah on March 5 of, 444 BC (Nehemiah 2:1–8). (In this article, a number of biblical dates are used, all of which have been under debate by scholars for hundreds of years. [Harold Hoehner](#) makes a strong case for each of the dates. Before we can make some calculations, we need to know how Daniel’s civilization counted time—by a solar year or a lunar year. A solar year has 365 days, 5 hours, 48 minutes, and 46 seconds, or 365.2422 days. A lunar year has exactly 360 days: 12 months of 30 days. [A lunar year has 12 rotation periods, or lunar months, which equal 354.367 Earth days (12×29.53059). However, ancient peoples rounded off the lunar month to 30 days. Thus, their lunar year would equal 360 days (30 days \times 12).] Since the lunar year was commonly used in ancient biblical times, it makes the most sense to use the lunar year in calculations.

We must also decide how to define the arrival of the Messiah. Do we use Jesus’s birthdate, the date he began his ministry, the date of his crucifixion, or some other date? The date that many scholars have accepted as the time of the Messiah’s arrival is Jesus’s triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The reason for choosing this date is that this is when Jesus publicly declared that he was the Messiah. Before then, he told only select people, like his disciples, and he often reminded them to keep his identity secret. History chronologists have estimated that Jesus’s triumphal entry fell on Monday, March 30, A.D. 33.

Calculating Gabriel’s Formula

Now we’re ready to do some math to determine if Gabriel did, in fact, predict Jesus’s arrival. We’ll start by determining how many days are in 483 lunar years: $360 \times 483 = 173,880$ days. Next, we’ll

convert those days back into solar years: $173,880 \div 365.2422 = 476.068$ years. After converting the decimal part (0.068) to days ($0.068 \times 365.2422 = 24.8$ days), the time prophesized for the Messiah to arrive comes out to be 476 years and 25 days. Adding this number to March 5, 444 BC—the date on which the decree to rebuild Jerusalem was issued—brings us to March 30, A.D. 33, the very day of the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem.

Is this match not remarkable? The remarkable accuracy of the predictions in the prophecy in Daniel [assuming the estimates are correctly interpreted and accurate] supports the truth of the prophecy, which in turn builds confidence in the authority and reliability of the Bible.

“ONLY God!”

- Only God could have provided the **exact timeline** for rebuilding Jerusalem and the First Temple.
- Only God could have provided the **exact timeline** for when the Jewish Messiah would arrive, His death and resurrection.
- Only God could have provided the **exact timeline** for “who” and when Jerusalem and the Second Temple would be destroyed.
- Only God could have provided the **exact timeline** for when “he” (a world leader) would arrive, and the Third Temple would be rebuilt, and when all the other “End Time” events would occur.
